Proposals

The following proposals were received prior to this AGM

Proposals for consideration/debate

- 1. That the Friday Roll Ups are made non-qualifiers
 - a. Monday roll ups are qualifiers every other week. Add in Eclectics, Malcolm's Trophy, Senior's match trophy, Bob Sawyer trophy etc that makes around 40 qualifiers a year. If every Friday is also a qualifier that adds another say 48 making around 88 qualifiers. In my opinion that's far too many.
 - b. I am not alone in wanting sometimes to play without a card in my hand and just play a friendly 4 ball. Short Gimmies allowed etc. I suspect that if Fridays continue as qualifier's we will see numbers of seniors playing outside the roll up.
 - c. In winter conditions (mud and rain) many people will not want to play a qualifier. Roll up numbers will become much smaller
 - d. Flexibility In winter we used to be able to make up our own rules to suit the conditions. E.G Take the ball off the bank when slippery or pick and place anywhere on the course when conditions are exceptionally bad. If it's a qualifier these options are not open to us.
 - e. Speed of play we are already concerned about our seniors getting round to the 1st within the allotted timescale. Non qualifiers are quicker to play.
 - f. Relationship with the pro shop The pro shop does not want to be stamping 40 cards every Monday & Friday. (Already complaining) They get nothing out of it and whilst some may say they are there to service us I think it's important to maintain a good relationship with them (something we do not have at the moment)
 - g. In conclusion I want the roll up to continue to have the ethos of togetherness and bonhomie. I don't want it to be ultra-strict, demanding that cards are entered every time we play. I want to play with different people every week and have a good laugh. The danger is that with too many rules' people will move to play outside the roll ups and we will lose that togetherness that has always been a feature of our seniors' group.
 - h. I am perfectly happy for Mondays to continue as qualifiers every other week and with the other comps think that is more than enough to ensure that our seniors group put in sufficient qualifying cards.

Proposed John McCarthy Seconded Steve Chalmers

The purpose is to allow everyone the play social golf without a card in their hand.

Following considerable debate

The motion was carried by a show of hands.

2. That the current Monday morning "Balls in the Bag" system be replaced by a random start sheet roll up to match that which currently pertains on Friday Mornings Seniors Roll Up

The purpose will be explained by the proposer at the AGM

The explained reasons were given that with a start sheet it would allow everyone to know their T times so they could just turn up and play without waiting for their turn to come according to the balls in the bag draw, thus allowing them to arrange and complete personal requirements before and after their round

The motion was defeated by a show of hands.

3. Members to consider having more medal competitions for the roll ups.

Proposed Paul Millerick Seconded Steve Lines

The purpose will be explained by the proposer at the AGM

The explained reasons were that it would allow low handicap players to win some of the competitions

The motion was carried by a show of hands.

But with the proviso that there would be minor prizes for Net score results and that any additional Medal competitions would be played in the late Spring/Summer/early Autumn. 2 addition Medal rounds will be added to our programme for 2022.

No further proposals were received prior to this meeting.

Seniors Roll Up

- General discussion on the ongoing format of the Monday and Friday Roll Up following the above resolution voting
 - Monday format Fun Game/Qualifier/Specials as planned appear acceptable to all
 - Fridays
 - Fridays will be for Social Golf and WILL NOT be qualifying competitions. 4ball groups can make their own winter rules etc and may wish to have a competition amongst themselves or against another 4-ball group. However, you are encouraged to put in as many "General play" cards as you can but remembering you must then play to the qualifying rules.
 - Due to the lack of attendee numbers that Fridays will go to a ONE T start off the FIRST commencing on the 12th November 2021 at 08.00 with 10 T times with any unused Seniors Reserve T times returning to the Club 24 hours after the opening of the 7-day booking window.
 - Friday the 29th October and Friday 5th November will remain a 2 T start with invites to play being sent out in the normal manner.
 - On Friday the 12th November we will have a ONE T start using 10 T times off the First. Our reserved T times will be open for 24 hours after the booking window opens 7 days before the play day.
 - On the 1st November you will receive an invitation to play on the 12th November and a Start Sheet will be provided on the 4th November which will allow "Team Captains" to book their 4-ball group in when the booking window opens on the 5th November. This window of opportunity will close at 07.59 on Saturday 6th November
 - For those attending the Friday Roll Up (as per the Start sheets) will have £1.00 taken from their Roll Up bank balance to cover administration – all of which we be added to the Captains Charity Pot.
 - Level of Prize Fund for Specials and Eclectics It was agreed to proceed in the same way as we do now.
 - Eclectics would be £10.00 to enter with a 60/40 split between prizes and Captains Charity
 - Malcolm's Trophy entrance fee will be £3.00 with all entry fees going to the Captains Charity
 - Poppy Day entrance fee will be £5.00 with all entry fees going to the Royal British Legion
 - The current pricing structure for Specials (Captains Day, Match Trophy etc) is acceptable

• Roll-up rules and general etiquette

- Captain Roger pointed out that it was not acceptable to include your name on Competition entry sheets only to inform the organiser that you were unable to play when chased for the entry fee
- Can everyone please ensure that IF they include their names on Competition Entry Sheets on the Seniors Notice Board or they say YES to attending a Competition that they pay the entry fee by the Due Date OR take their name off before the Competition closing date. This will save the organises considerable time in not having to chase entry fee money.

• Slow Play

 Captain Roger reminded everyone about the need to keep up a good pace when playing golf, he asked everyone t have a good look at our Seniors Rules of Golf and to remember 3 minutes is just 3 minutes when looking for your ball.
